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Tales from your Parish Clerk



I hope you have all had a fantastic summer!

Whilst my Councillors attempted to enjoy their summer recess, I was beavering away as usual but at a more relaxed pace which has been lovely. It is that time of the year when you can do all the little things that you have been putting off (like

filing for example) and I've manged to catch up and I am ready and raring to go.

With all this hot weather and very little rain you may have noticed that our village pond is more like a village puddle at the moment. I have been trying to secure an onsite appointment with the principal engineers at West Berkshire Council who initially worked with us on the excavation project and liaised with the contractors assigned to do the work. Summer holidays have got in the way of booking in a date for everyone concerned and I hope that by the time you are reading this, we have a date in the diary and can look at how we can resolve this issue.

We have seen that people have been enjoying spending the long summer holidays and fine weather up at the recreation ground which is brilliant. Sadly, the table tennis equipment has taken a bit of a battering (has a dog been attempting to play?! It looks like bite marks...) so not only is the box broken, so are the bats and the second lot of balls we have provided! The trouble with this is, that a small minority of folk ruin it for others who actually want to play. I will source some new bats made of an alternative material and hopefully less resisitent to this scale of damage in the future. I will get some more



balls as well and replace the box they are stored in one last time. If they are damaged again, they will not be replaced as we can't keep spending public money on this.

In other playground news, thanks to a £373.26 grant from West Berkshire Council via our Ward Councillor, Carolyne Culver we have been able to purchase a couple of new litter bins. These are lidded bins which means litter cannot blow out of the bin and swirl around the playground, making it a much nicer place to be! As they have a lid, which requires a key to remove, the Council have thankfully agreed to entering into a contract with Triangle Management to empty these bins on a monthly basis (or more if needed). This means that neither me, nor Paul Finch need to don our rubber gloves again and empty them ourselves! Woohoo!

We have noticed that the pigeons have taken a fancy to perching above the new (ish) baby swings and leaving their mark so to speak... One seat is protected and clean (thanks Tracey and Graham!) and the other is on my list to sort out ASAP. Sorry little ones, I will get this sorted!

As we move towards the autumn, the Council's attention turns to budget setting, five year plans and the precept. We would be interested to hear your thoughts about future projects so we can investigate costs and consider them in the 2023 / 2024 budget. You can do this by speaking to any of the Councillors, or me, or pop along to a meeting and share your ideas. We'd love to hear from you.

We hope to see you at a meeting soon, we are back face to face in the School hall but we have the ability to hop back on Zoom if we need to.

Update from Councillor Carolyne Culver

Dear Residents,

I hope you found my latest newsletter interesting. I won't repeat what was in it.



News from your West Berkshire councillor. Representing West Ilsley, East Ilsley, Compton, Hampstead Norreys, Frilsham and Yattendon

There is a public petition asking West Berkshire

Council to make 'hedgehog highways' a condition for major planning applications. According to the 'State of Britain's Hedgehog's report, hedgehog numbers are down in rural areas by between 30% and 75% since 2000. If the council accepts the petition, developers of big new housing estates would be required to leave small holes in the bottom of fences so that hedgehogs can travel across the site. My friend Jill Hoblin, a wildlife campaigner from Winterbourne, started the public petition. Visit this link for more information and to sign the petition tinyurl.com/yc2saa68

You will have seen the advert hanging from your bin about the new food waste collection scheme. The advert says that between 22 August and 31 October residents will receive a kitchen food waste caddy, an outside food waste caddy and a roll of compostable liners delivered to your door. If anyone would like to help me water the orchard next to the allotments let me know! I am using watering cans and buckets because of the hosepipe ban.

There will be a public meeting about the cost of living crisis at 7.30pm on Wednesday 21 September at St John's Church in Newbury. The primary aim of the meeting will be to coordinate the community response to the crisis and develop a network of support hubs. These hubs would provide a warm and comfortable space for residents who are unable to heat their homes, and signpost people to where they can get more support. The meeting is being organised by my colleague Councillor Steve Masters and will be chaired by a member of the church community. All are welcome.

You will have seen lots of publicity for GreenFest by now. It is shaping up to be a very impressive event. The organisers are working extremely hard to make this a success. I will be there all day and speaking in the afternoon, so hopefully see you there - Hampstead Norreys on Saturday 10 September.

From a garden office in East IIsley to the Edinburgh Fringe...

In the last EIC we advertised the July performance of a locally penned play, **In Her Defence** as part of a journey to take it to the Edinburgh Fringe Festival in August. Well...we made it!

Sincerest thanks to all the residents, friends and families that helped us to achieve this ambition by coming to see the Fringe preview in July and supporting and encouraging us at every step.

The original play, written in lockdown in the garden office, was called **Evil Will Come** by Helen Saxton (written under the pen name Alexi Stonehouse) and was performed by the Compton Players in November 2021. We made some small modifications and gave it the new name, **In Her Defence**, and it was submitted to the Oxfordshire Drama Festival of one-act plays performed in June 2022 with the same cast. It was chosen as one of the three best plays to be repeated on the final night of the festival, where it won the Original Playwriting Award for best new play.



We had already decided to take it to the Edinburgh Fringe, rewriting part of the play so that it could be performed by just two players. Rehearsals ran through June and July, alongside trimming the set down enough so it could all be driven in one car the 400 miles to Scotland.

Opening 'night' was 22nd August and the **four star** reviews have been fantastic, with the *Edinburgh Guide* stating: "The ending is so brilliantly clever it matches the dastardly denouement of 'The Murder of Roger Ackroyd' (voted 'best crime novel ever written') and the British Theatre Guide praising the skilful writing and 'wicked twist', and audience members saying: 'The acting performances, the writing and the direction of the piece were all excellent'.

This will have been an experience like no other, unlikely to be repeated - but who knows? This could be just the start! I say that as I am writing this on behalf of Helen, Pete, Mel, Evie, and James, as they are still in Edinburgh as this magazine goes to print!

On behalf of *Dead Herring*, thanks again for supporting them on their adventure to get to the Edinburgh Fringe.



The Downland Practice





It's that time of year again! Our first flu/COVID vaccination clinics will be held in October 2022. If you are eligible, you will be offered a flu vaccination and we will aim to also offer a COVID Autumn booster (subject to delivery from suppliers) in the same appointment. Invites will be sent to eligible patients in 'waves' to manage booking demand. The first wave of invites will be sent in the next couple of weeks. Patients with a mobile number on their records will be sent a text with a link to book an appointment online (your mobile phone will need access to the internet). If we don't have your mobile number on file, now is the time to update us. If you don't have a mobile number registered with us, we will call you to book you in. If you receive a text but can't access the internet via your mobile phone, just give us a call. Please wait to be invited. We need to keep our telephone lines available for patients requiring medical help so please do not call us to chase your invite. All eligible patients will be invited. BE AWARE: The police have received reports of a scam involving patients being offered flu/covid vaccinations in exchange for a fee/bank details. If you have received a call you are unsure about, call the surgery for advice. The NHS will never ask you for your bank account/card details, ask you for your PIN number or banking password or arrive unannounced at your home to administer your flu/covid vaccine

Foodbank Community Collection Point

The Downland Practice (Chieveley site) has now become a community collection point for West Berks Foodbank. Our staff have been running a collection for the past few months and we are proud to now open up our collection point to the wider community. The collection basket is located in the front lobby (roadside) at Chieveley Surgery and we welcome your donations. Shopping lists of currently needed items, and leaflets on how to access foodbank support are situated next to the basket.

Abuse of NHS staff

There have been several patients behaving in an inappropriate manner towards the staff whilst using the pharmacy, practice telephone and text messaging facilities. Behaving in an inappropriate manner towards our staff is not to be tolerated. We have now placed up NHS posters across both sites to remind patients to behave when using NHS services at the downland practice. This is still an issue at the practice, patients who misbehave towards any of our staff will be given a warning letter, where appropriate then the Police will be informed, this may end up with the patient receiving a Public Order Offence and being removed from the Downland Practice List.

<u>Paramedic</u>

Mike Essery joined the team back in January 2022. Mike is seeing patients who have urgent on the day demands, if it is appropriate then the patient will be handed over the care of the Duty Doctor. This will allow the practice to eventually free up some GP time so that we can offer more routine GP appointments to our patients. Mike has been well received by many of the patients he as seen to date.

Change GP Requests

We are getting several change GP requests; this is where the patient's named GP is requested to be changed for another GP. Please be aware that if the GP you request already has a full list of patients, then you will be allocated to a GP who has gaps in their patient list. This then reduces a GP having too many patients on their list and reduces their patients from having to wait longer to see them for a routine appointment. From time to time the GP lists are amended

so that the spread of patients is equal across the GP's who work at the Practice. A GP who works four days a week will have a patient list double that of a GP who works two days a week. The Practice always attempts to send patients a text to notify them of the change on their named GP, failing this an email will be sent, failing that then a letter will be sent out. Whilst we endeavour to action GP change requests within a four week period this can be longer due to large GP lists and GP annual leave.

Staff Changes

Barbara Howe the Clinical Pharmacist is left the team at the end of March 2022. She may still be about in the Downland Pharmacy for a few months as she has elected to undertake Pharmacy Locum Work. The Downland Practice are in the process of recruiting a new Clinical Pharmacist. A Clinical Pharmacist role is becoming more embedded at the surgery, they undertake medication reviews for patients and can see patients for chronic health disease reviews and some can deal with urgent on the day patients. This is freeing up GP time so that the GP's can see other patients with more complexed needs that take longer than the standard 10-minute GP appointment. The Downland Practice has been successful in recruiting a new Pharmacist to run the Downland Pharmacy. Sharifah Khan currently works for Boots in Thatcham and is due to start in Mid July 2022.

Patient Participation Group (PPG)

The Downland Practice PPG has been in operation for several years but in the last few months we have started to formalise this group more. We now have a Chairperson and a PPG Committee; this PPG Committee currently exists from the previous PPG members who are generally representatives of the Parish Councils. If any patient withes to join the PPG then they are most welcome to email at pm.downland@nhs.net . PPG members will be sent out updates from the practice by email. The PPG are working on developing the PPG area of the Downland Practice website and will be looking to increase PPG Membership across the patient population.

Dr Curtis Update

Dr Curtis has now left the Downland Practice so that he can return to his medical studies in tropical diseases. Dr Curtis has been a GP Partner at the practice for over 10 years, he first arrived at the Downland Practice as a GP Registrar. Dr Curtis will be missed by his patients and team members at the practice. Dr Victoria Ashall will be taking over from Dr Curtis, Dr Ashall is a GP partner at another GP practice and is an experienced GP. There may be some changes in allocations of patients until her arrival in early November 2022.

Berkshire Vision

Looking after your sight

All our senses are precious, but sight is the sense people fear losing the most, yet many of us don't know how to look after our eyes.



It is recommended that everyone get their eyes tested at least once every two years, even if no vision problems have been noticed. An optometrist can often recognise the signs of an eye condition, or even an underlying health conditions, before you have noticed any changes in your vision. Get a regular eye test - Not just for yourself, but your children too. A recent survey by the College of Optometrists revealed 23% of parents had never taken their children for an eye test. You are never too old, or too young to have an eye examination.

Eat well - Studies show that what we eat can affect our vision. Foods recommended for eye health include broad leaf greens such as kale and spinach, brightly coloured fruit and veg such as corn, carrots, orange sweet peppers and oranges, Oily fish like salmon, tuna and mackerel, Broccoli and Eggs.

Maintain a healthy weight and move more - Being overweight and/or lack of exercise can affect not only our health generally, but the health of our eyes, raising the risk of developing some of the major causes of sight loss, such as diabetes or high blood pressure.

Stop Smoking - After ageing, smoking is the biggest risk factor for developing several of most common sight loss conditions.

Protect your eyes from the sun - Protecting your eyes from the sun is very important and should not be underestimated. Your sunglasses should have the CE mark on them which ensures that they are giving you the right level of ultraviolet protection. UV has an accumulative impact on our skin and our eyes. Children should be encouraged to spend time outdoors for healthy eye development, but don't forget hats and sunglasses to help protect their eyes for later life too!
